

Following Their Voices-Student Voice Tool

Gateway teachers and students have been busy exploring a new online tool designed to amplify student voice in the classroom. This innovative tool enables students to provide valuable feedback about their learning, which teachers use to inform instructional decisions.

Check-ins are conducted when teachers are trying new strategies or reaching critical points in the curriculum where gauging student understanding is essential. The feedback helps teachers respond to student needs and reflect on evidence to accelerate learning and growth.

Through the tool, students have the opportunity to reflect on their learning and share insights with teachers, including:

- What they are learning.
- Where they believe they are in their learning journey, supported by evidence.
- · Which teaching strategies help them the most.
- How they feel about their learning progress.

Teachers review this data during weekly collaboration meetings, using it to inform both individual and school-wide goals. The tool's consistent, accessible, and user-friendly format enhances the use of student voice to adapt teaching practices and support student success.
