Gateway School is proud to continue as a Following Their Voices (FTV) school, a commitment aimed at enhancing the educational success of First Nations, Inuit, and Métis students.



This year, teachers are focusing on a new set of tools designed to strengthen instruction and student engagement.

The first tool, the **Check-in Tool**, gathers students' feedback in real time, allowing teachers to assess the impact of their lessons on student learning.

Next, **Clarity Packs** support teachers in creating curriculumaligned learning goals, rubrics, vocabulary lists, and teaching strategies to enrich lessons.

Finally, the **Peer Observation Tool** provides an opportunity for teachers to observe one another, set student-centered goals, and create action plans for ongoing improvement.

Together, these tools help create clear, intentional lessons, amplify student voice, and foster collaborative professional growth, all in support of our commitment to the success of every student.
